Fern Scott Olsson's paintings deal with everyday life and are far from pompous and grandeur: children at play, people strolling along city streets, and families on the beach. The most spectacular at this exhibition are the triptychs and diptychs. The works of Fern Scott Olsson are fresh in composition with usage of contrasting colours that hang together successfully in a determined style.

Some works of a small format, symbolise upper class men in position of power through their distinctive body language are very well done.
