

Arne Frifarare was born in Stockholm 1956.

Education: 1982 - 1987 Royal University College of Fine Arts, Stockholm. 1979 - 1980 Pembys målarskola. 1978 - 1979 Gerlesborgsskolan.

The Painting Poet's Language.

Carpaccio was the name of a Venetian young-rennaissance painter who captured the city and its inhabitants as a perpetual story. Sneaking quitely through the narrow streets, passing the crowded squares, in solitude on pedestal's in their palaces fearing the plague - or cherishing the coming carnevale's endless possibilities for incognito amusement. A few hundred miles north in Sweden other intrigues and plots, games of romp and lusts were played out in a considerably more barren environment. Rulers such as Harald, Erik and Magnus were also making schemes but were disturbed by the unpredictable, erratic turns of fate, moments of bliss or another year of famine.

Arne Frifarare repaints the history like a contemporary Carpaccio, who has received the key to the chamber of eternal light, where everything re-appears only slightly jolted. The frame of mind is tightened just a touch or nuance to capture a more serene existence. Just like on an enchanted autumnal day the light cuts through - exceptionally sharp in contours and contrasts.

The painter of piety, who thought himself being the tool of God, generously lends from his own pantry to his present day colleague. Limewashed walls of faith, of hope and for prayers of mercy, are crouching below the mountain ridges struggling to rise out of the soil. "Outremer" flashes across a distant blue mountain just like "Hollywood" in another distant fairytale land, constantly reinventing reality. Ultramarine, in Swedish, the pigment of dreams and fairytale castles, was in Caravaggios time extracted from a semi-precious stone. Arne Frifarare moves comfortably, and by necessity, throughout history and between the chambers of the "then" and "now". For us, he restores the poem, the fairytale and the fantasy as means to conquer life.



Fern was born in Toronto Canada and has a Bachelor of Arts (visual) from the University of Toronto. Further studies brought her to Stockholm,

Sweden where she has since put down roots and settled into a studio seeped in tradition in Gustavsberg, famous for Sweden's renowned porcelain

factory situated just outside Stockholm.

"Painting is a way for me to explore my environment. Even though I expect to find differences, I often find similarities. I love to watch people in cafés,

on the street and in the shops. I wonder who they are, where they have been and where they are going. In my work, I ask these questions and leave

them to you, the observer to answer."

At times ironic, at other times familiar, Scott Olsson is a philosophical painter whose work sits well in time. She is an emerging artist worth watching

out for.

Fern Scott Olsson's paintings deal with everyday life and are far from "pompous" and "grandeur": children at play, people strolling along city streets,



Gabrielle pool

Gabrielle pool

New Zealand born Gabrielle Pool has had an extensive career in the arts with a string of successful exhibitions in Australia, New Zealand, Japan and Europe and is now emerging as one of Australia's leading artists. Gabrielle's recent inspiration has come from the beauty and traditions of Tribal Africa. She feels strongly that these traditions should be protected and learnt from and not lost to the influences of the western world.

In 2006 with the help of Stuart Macleod a National Geographic Field Producer Gabrielle went to live in a remote southern Ethiopian village, Winkyari with the Hamer People. Macleod instructed the warriors of the village armed with spears and AK47"s that he was leaving Gabrielle with them in their care for a short time. He added that she was a relative. That bond meant one important thing to them – if she dies – we die.

It was during this time that her last three years of work were conceived. Gabrielle immersed herself into their world in which no spoken word was exchanged. Her experiences with the Hamer people were expressed in her artworks. The soft ink landscapes, mirages of Winkyare Village rising from the heat of the African bush, gentle paintings of Hamer boys taking "moon rides" on the horns of cattle and of course her strong portraits. In the last year Gabrielle has evolved this work using a looser style and greater use of abstraction. She has had many private commissions' world wide relating to the work. Her latest body will be the last in the Ethiopian experience, which is to be exhibited in Australia in November 2009.

In January 2010 Gabrielle is returning to Africa to live with Massai Tribe for 12 weeks. We wait with anticipation to see the images that will immerge, with Gabrielle ever pushing and exploring her immense talent forward. Gabrielle Pool's dedication to her art and strong personal beliefs, which she so sensitively portrays in her paintings, have made her an artists to watch and follow.

On her return from Kenya a documentary will be published about her journey, Eclectic Fine Art believes that Gabrielle Pool is a young artist with a very bright future ahead of her.





James leggat

James leggat

James Leggat was born and educated in Scotland; he attended Glasgow school of art and then went on to teach art.

Having completed four years of teaching art Leggat decided to follow his heart and took his first studio where he began his career as a painter.

From his studio in Scotland, Leggat had his first International show in Newfoundland: Canada in 1969, today his work is held in the Newfoundland University Collection. Leggat left Scotland in 1970 to paint in Sweden where he had his first solo exhibition in 1974. He had extensive shows during his time there exhibiting in both Oslo and Stockholm. As his work progressed he moved to Munich, Germany where his success as a painter followed him. Leggat had developed his technique and his use of oil and was becoming known for his expressive figurative painting mixed with a slight abstraction. Leggat spent 15 years in Munich having numerous exhibitions and one-man shows. Leggat returned to the UK eight years ago and presently works from his studio in Dulwich.

Leggat from his early days as a painter has held an enormous respect for the Renaissance movement, this can be seen in his work along with the influence of Francis Bacon and his love of Leonardo DaVinci. He has developed a rich pallet over the years using his oil with confidence and ease. His understanding of the human form and his exploration into its movement and how universal events mold it, create striking images of powerful figures controlling the elements – generating mystical paintings, almost God like interpretation of mortals answering and commanding respect for the space they inhabit.

Leggat uses the female form as a Goddess, she represents the power over good over evil, she can create the storm or calm the sea. Exercising his innate understanding of light mingled with his use of perspective and line along with his confident rich pallet he captures the imagination to look behind the future and understand our present. This can be seen very clearly in "Pyramids of Light" and "Autumn Dance"; In "Pyramids of Light" we reflect on the past whilst we build a future moving into a rich horizon of hope and fulfillment. In "Autumn Dance" you are invited to relish in the light and colour, of all that surrounds us and the eroticism of candor and love.

Leggat's work encompasses a freedom to explore emotive issues which challenge us in all directions. Coming into contact with this artist is an experience; Leggat is not frightened to portray the power that we all have – within us – to question who and what we are. In his paintings he clouds the fact with abstraction and makes the eroticism the question; he uses the figurative form creating theatrical gestures and amazing fantasy – he interprets his figures in a very effective language which is heavily influenced by his innate understanding of movement. His distortion of light and shape along with his defined use of rich colour and sharp lines invites his audience to live and explore the layers within his work.





Scottish Born Kate Macdonald is a fast emerging artist in her native Scotland and where she now lives in Chile.

To quote her:

"The initial point of departure in my work is usually derived from everyday experiences, such as, travels by bus, swimming in the pool, the beach, a neighbour who collects birds, the countryside, etc. an everyday situation that startles the mind and becomes fixed. These images are collected sometimes by drawing but are usually just a notion in the memory and that allow invention to begin in paint. And in the process of painting, these memories begin to inhabit their own worlds. Through this process of transformation these images are manipulated into fictional paintings that are dealt with in a neo-expressionistic form. Although other possible connotations exist, this work is, at its core, dealing with the complexities of human interaction."



Oliver wilson

Oliver wilson

Oliver Wilson was born in England, educated at Stowe and has a Fine Arts Degree from Newcastle University. By the late 1990's Wilson was selling his work successfully in the private market. Wilson's unique talent was soon recognized by galleries in London, his first two man show in 2001 was a sell out. Today Wilson has a string of dominant exhibitions behind him which has also built up a strong following for his art. He continues to progress and explore his art producing new and exciting bodies of work with each collection.

"... I am trying to portray the figure through the environment, i.e. water, not only does water encompass and surround the figure, but it also determines its representation and therefore its visual existence. By seeing the figure through this greater force, which moulds it, it can be seen as an allegory for a higher spiritual level which controls and shapes our lives."

His abstract figurative paintings take his audience into his command of light and darkness, the human form transcending through his chosen natural element, water, virtually creating three-dimensional forms, generating ethereal images which evoke the mind to explore anonymous figures suspended in motion in his watery world, taking you into the past one minute, propelling you into the future the next.

"My painting challenges me every day – water is one of the hardest things to paint well, and for me it has that fluidity to create light and movement through the whole painting... Using water as my natural element allows me to explore the flesh and all its qualities; the light gives my work almost a sculptural form reminiscent of Rodin's sculptural sketches."

Wilson is an academic artist whose traditional approach to his canvas and use of pallet, makes him an English painter to follow closely in today's contemporary art world.





Stefan petridis

"After many years of a conscious abstinence from presenting my work, it is with great joy that I have received the invitation of YiorgosTzaneris and the GALLERY GENESIS, which is entering with such force the artistic map of Athens. I am coming back with works of fondly remembered times of poetry and romanticism... works which have never been shown in Greece before. Their time is now.

These works represent a power and enthusiasm of days which have laid the foundation for the future. This applies both to experimenting with diverse materials, the mixed techniques with building material, natural colorings dust, oils and acrylics, as well as to what lies behind all... The preservation of the soul's youth, of a vision and of optimism...

The realism of the details, the narrative aspect and the expressionistic chromatic scale suggest to the viewer a world with a character different from the known, featuring the opposition of light and shadow, which is stressed by a painting surface done in relief, or with the juxtaposition of images, in different work cycles, whose protagonists were for example ship's passengers (AMAZON, 1998-2000) and motifs that are centered on courting fishes... Always trying to commit the viewer to confronting life and love as a game although faceless and perhaps, purposeless...

The multiplicity of the combinations and their repetion is combined with the inability to express the contradictory nature of the modern world. The symbolic extensions, however transcend these limits and invert the prevailing cruel practice of the world, as the "weak" individual does not appear to be subjected by the "powerful". It is no longer the result that is a burden, but the act itself, the struggle with forces of a dynamic scope that are not controlled by anyone...

The cycle which has once opened with these works has lead me to today. The themes have changed through time. But the core of being human remains - either through nature or through our very own nature. The four elements can transform everything, such is their force. In the end catharsis prevails.....

In Acapulco, on a Friday morning... It was January the 22nd, 2010..."

Stefan Petridis was born in Arolsen, Germany. He lived in Thessaloniki, Greece until 1978. Then he went to Berlin, Germany, where he studied from 1978-1984 medicine and from 1984 – 1988 painting in the HDK Berlin, as a student of Diehl and Hoedicke. In 1986 he founded the "Atelier Aufbruch" in Berlin. In 1988 he studied in the Art Students League in New York as a student of Hector Diaz.

Today he lives and works during spring and summer on the island of Paros, Greece, and shares the winters between Athens and the world...






